If you are a student with a home address in the East Lancashire region, then you could be eligible for **free transport** to Lancaster University and back, under the new East Lancashire Lift Share scheme, being trialled from 20<sup>th</sup> April 2009.

If you have a car and would be willing to offer lifts to other students from your area, then you would be able to claim back your petrol costs, and get other incentives such as free parking on campus. All you need to do is sign up at <http://www.liftshare.com/v3/pages/reguser.asp?sid=1301&sid2=1332&sid3=0>, and let us know when you will be travelling to and from campus, and when you would be willing to offer lifts to others.

In return for offering a lift for at least two terms, we will reimburse your petrol costs, and give you a free campus parking permit, as well as a reduced price MOT and other incentives.

If you don't have a car, or don't wish to use it every day, you can sign up as a passenger seeking a lift, and you can choose from any of the available drivers in your area. If lots of drivers sign up, you should be able to find a journey time to suit your needs.

Also, if you sign up to the new scheme as a passenger, then you would be eligible for the guaranteed ride home scheme, which would mean that if you were stranded on campus, we would do everything we could to get you a lift home.

Lift sharing is a safe, cost-free and convenient alternative to public transport. We recommend that when meeting for the first time, you arrange to meet your travel companions in a public place, and carry ID with you.

Could I please ask you to consider using the lift share scheme, and let us know if you would like further information on it? Thanks for your time.
